

# COLLINS & JOYCE

## JOANN GENETTE

*Position* – Currently Freelance Audio Voice-over. My career (for over 24 years) was on-air work in terrestrial radio in Chicagoland.

I recently launched an online radio playlist (sort of like a radio station) playing only women musical artists. I'm reaching out to my friends and women in media to send me their podcasts, voice work, stand-up comedy, etc. It's a format devoted entirely to women because for far too long, the industry marginalized women with remarkable talent. I want women's voices to be heard.

*Born & Raise* – Born in Berwyn, Illinois but raised in Lombard. DuPage County stayed my home for most of my life. I graduated from Montini High School. I'm a Catholic School kid.



*Education* – I attended the Illinois Media School. I decided to focus on radio instead of television. I decided to take every job I could find. I took all the gigs the other people passed over. I figured the best way to know the radio industry was to do the hard work involved. When other people were spending their 20's at the bar, I was taking the overnight shifts nobody wanted to do.

*Your first job* – A telemarketing job bothering people over the phone. I sold Death & Dismemberment Insurance which meant the policy only paid if the person ended up dismembered at death. Looking back now, It may have been a scam.

*How did you get started in broadcasting field* – I was an only child so I watched a lot of television and listened to a lot of radio. At the age of 19, I purchased a Hi-Tech video camera from Circuit City and started filming everything and everybody. For about 2 years, I had a side hustle making home movies for people using photographs and dubbing in music. It's funny to think about how technology has changed.

I originally wanted to work in television but learned the industry was very unkind to women due to objectification so I picked radio instead. Radio allowed me to have a voice while staying somewhat anonymous when I wasn't working.

*Your first job in broadcasting field* – I worked as an intern at WLUP 97.9 FM in the early 90's for Kevin Matthews in the morning and sometimes for Danny Bonaduce in Mid-days. The station was located inside the Hancock Building in Chicago. It was called Evergreen Media and the man in charge was Larry Wert. 3 stations were all located in the same hallway. AM 1000 MVP which had Steve Dahl & Bruce Wolf doing mornings. Occasionally I'd ride up in the elevator with Steve Dahl. Even though I wasn't working on his radio station, I would hear him making fun of me on the air. He's a story teller. He'd make up stories about me for content on the air. It was funny. I can't remember what nickname he gave me, but it was essentially portraying me as a ditzzy young girl. People asked me if I was offended. I wasn't. I actually felt honored to be the butt of Steve Dahl's jokes. Most of the stuff he was saying wasn't true anyway. I got to meet Christina Filliagi who did radio in Chicago for decades. My dad loved her and she was kind enough to go to the Live "American Idol" shows with him. They weren't dating or anything, but since they both loved that television show, somehow they found each other and attended the events. When I think back now, it was kind of strange.

The next door over was WLUP, 97.9 FM The Loop with Kevin Matthews. This is where I did my internship. My second day on the job, I was brought into a side studio by Larry Wert. He and a production guy told

me to record and notate anytime Howard Stern said something bad about them. I already knew Howard Stern from his TV show and from David Letterman, but this was the first time he was being piped into Chicago radio. He was saying stuff like "I hope Larry Wert gets cancer." and all sorts of outrageous things. I noted and recorded a couple of things because there was no way I could lie, but a few times I just giggled and let it slide. I think there was some lawsuit but I was just an intern so those details were

never shared with me. On most days I'd change the toner in the fax machine. I was sent out to do all sorts of crazy stunts. I was usually sent down to the main lobby to get celebrity guests. I ran the control board sometimes. I did all sorts of things. Danny Bonaduce let me smoke cigarettes with him in his tiny office. It was actually a walk-in closet converted into an office. I remember he came to work one day with his new baby daughter and was trying to hand her to me. At that time, I didn't have a lot of experience with babies so I was all stiff and uncomfortable, not maternal at all. I was given lots of crazy tasks during my internship. Most of the things wouldn't be allowed today.

The third door in the hall of the Hancock building was 103.5 FM which was called The Blaze (but also called ROCK 103.5). This is where Mancow did his show. He was relatively new but still very popular. My demo (early 20s) really loved Mancow. I was frightened by him for some reason. One day he sent chickens loose down the hallway. I have lots of crazy stories of those days.

My first paid job was a suburban radio station 92.7 FM WCBR. We were still cutting reel-to-reel tapes with a razor. The playlist on the station was mostly independent musical artists (Poi Dog Pondering, Ani Difranco, Dar Williams, etc). When we weren't playing music, the station sold off blocks of airtime to people who wanted to do radio shows. I was the producer for those shows running the equipment and answering phones. We had all sorts of odd programming. Psychic Mediums, Motorcycles, etc. There was a show about horticulture called "How's it Growing?". People mostly called in with questions on how to grow marijuana in their basements. A comedy group did a funny show called "Dagnabbit". The strangest brokered show was "Shats, the clown". He was some guy who came in and verbally insulted all the callers and sometimes he cursed and swore. We received plenty of complaints about him. It was funny. I worked at WCBR for about 3 years until the station was sold to new owners who decided to keep me around.

*What was your job involve with WBIG* – During the recession years (2009-2010) I did the Radio Shopping Show for 2 hours every morning. I also had a one hour show that follows shopping. I was essentially allowed to do anything I wanted. I did a talk show interviewing people of interest and celebrities. The time slot was called THE BIG WAKE UP CALL. I had a producer but she kept stealing things from me because she hated me. She truly hated me which is very funny now. I think she had the timeslot prior or she had wanted the timeslot. I'm not sure. She truly hated me so we barely spoke. She'd book guests for me but keep all the promotional items for herself in the trunk of her car. An example was when she booked an author for me to interview. I'd ask about the book and she'd tell me it never arrived. I'd conduct the interview anyway and then learn she sold the book on Ebay or something. Wine of the Month Club, Celebrity Swag, DVDs ... she kept all the good stuff. She was doing a whole bunch of shady stuff and if I remember correctly, she pretended she was me a few times. I don't remember her name. It was a bad experience which didn't last very long. Eventually Ryan Gatenby was hired and he joined me in the morning. We started doing a duo show for a few months. He's still going strong doing the show solo. He gets really great guests. He's very talented and a very nice guy.

*What was your work involve at WLS-AM & WLS-FM* – At WLS-AM, I was a news anchor and reporter, usually during the evenings. At WLS-FM, I helped in the afternoons with Robert Murphy. I had worked with him before in the late 90s at a station that was R&B Oldies, but it even-

tually changed formats to ALL 80s Music. At WLS-FM, I was a Traffic Reporter and sidekick. I juggled both stations and did whatever duties they needed me to do on the air. There was a stairwell in the building at 190 North State Street. I'd go up and down sometimes. I've always enjoyed reporting news but it can start to take its toll on a person's mental health. I have a unique skill where I can take a 2 page story and condense it into a few sentences for brevity and broadcast. I am also skilled at taking Associated Press stories and simplifying them for an audience at an 8th grade level.

At WLS-FM, I got to work alongside Brant Miller (Chicago's Weatherman) and the Legendary Dick Biondi. I have some great stories about him. I also worked with John Landecker. All very nice guys and Chicago legends.

*How do you prepare yourself before going on the air* – It depends on the gig or role I play. A friend in production taught me a skill long ago to eliminate "dry mouth". If you do a motorboat sound or a raspberry with your lips, it actually stimulates the parts of your mouth that creates saliva. That's why I never wanted cameras pointed at me before I went on the air. I always did that silly motorboat raspberry sound effect before hitting the microphone. I looked ridiculous. The people working around me got used to my quirky mouth tricks. At least, I hope they did.

*If you could change anything about your job what would you change* – Society still doesn't value women's voices enough. There was an old belief in radio that women were a novelty. It's part of that 99% of women facing sexism in media. Once upon a time in music radio, no two songs performed by women were allowed to be played back-to-back. I was told audiences would tune out if they were forced to listen to a women's voice for too long. Isn't that awful? It's finally starting to change but marginalizing women was the norm in media. I'd just like to see more women succeed by being allowed more opportunities. I lost out on a few gigs to men who didn't have my experience. I try not to get bitter about it. Chicago is finally letting women have powerful roles in radio but it's long overdue. I don't want to share the bad stories because it's all in the past, but there was one radio station where only one woman was employed. When the station went out of business, none of the men remembered to call her and tell her. She showed up for work and the door was locked. It took her several hours to find out what all the men knew the night before. To say women

are marginalized and ignored in radio is an understatement. I won't share that woman's name, but it was very sexist.

*What was your favorite position in radio* – I did a morning co-host and producer job at WERV 95.9 FM with Scott Mackay. It was a classic rock format. We did a lot of fun things. We were very silly. The money was terrible but the job was fun. Scott Mackay is very talented.

*What was your least position in radio* – Even though I worked at KISS-FM 103.5 for over 7 years on a high-profile and successful morning show (DreX), it wasn't my favorite gig. I didn't hate it or anything, it just wasn't my favorite job despite being the gig that paid the most and supplied me with the most exposure. It was a CHR Hits Station and I was starting to grow out of night-clubbing, N'Sync and beer bong. It wasn't my focus anymore. I am very grateful for having that gig, but it wasn't my favorite.

*What do you feel one needs to become successful in the media* – You must have thick skin to handle the online comments which will subject you to bullying. The public still doesn't view employees in media as actual people. Especially the women. You just have to remember that you're never going to please everyone. For me, I think I originally got into the radio business with some illusion I'd become rich and famous. I had fantasies of being a female Wolfman Jack. Reality quickly hit me in the face. Since technology is always changing (rapidly) it's hard to stay on top in media, so I've always told students to focus on longevity and not fame. My teachers and mentors told me do not focus on popularity because that's fleeting. I really enjoyed working in the industry so that was my main goal -To continue working in a field I understood and loved.

*Your future plans* – I recently moved to Southern California with my family. I was trying to transition into the Hospitality industry. My long term goal was Resort Management (Disney, Universal, etc). Unfortunately, Covid-19 has stalled that industry and its growth but hopefully it will return. I still enjoy doing audio work. I trained my voice to be marketable so I feel like I should be able to use my skills but finding a stable gig has been a challenge.

*Favorite Movie* – Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind. Other favorites: E.T. The Extra Terrestrial and Drop Dead Fred (a comedy movie very few people remember)

*Favorite Actors/actresses* – Even though I didn't want to do standup comedy or anything, My original inspirations were Johnny Carson, Joan Rivers and Conan O'Brien.

*Three things that describe you best* – I'm definitely an extrovert. I enjoy observing things so "observationist" would describe me -but I'm not sure that's even a real word. I'm not always comfortable saying good things about myself. I don't suffer from poor self-esteem or anything, I just don't know how to promote myself very well. It's probably the result of being raised Catholic.

*One thing you can't stand* – Sexism and Inequality for women. I'm not exactly sure what happened over the course of my lifetime. I grew up feeling like the playing field was fair and feminism wasn't something I even had to worry about. Inequality for women seemed like an old timey issue. I guess I was naïve. It seemed like women were represented more in positions of power prior to 2008 or 2010. I remember working for plenty of powerful women before 2008. I've talked to a lot of other women who feel the same way. It's like something shifted and suddenly women were being marginalized again. It feels like I woke up one day and I needed to play Battle of The Sexes. I found myself having to remind my male co-workers that I was a person and not an object. It was very strange. Being taken seriously got harder and harder. There may be some link to social media, society's access to free pornography, or maybe the lack of small businesses. I look around and say "Huh? What happened?"

*Personal heroes* – I really love Madonna. I've been watching her work hard since 1984. I can't sing or dance like her but I feel lucky to live in a time I got to watch her do her thing. Our personalities are wildly different, but I admire her so much. When David Bowie died, I remember everybody saying how lucky they were to live at the same time David Bowie made music. I liked him but I feel grateful to watch Madonna do her stuff.

She's continued to bust through barriers and stereotypes. Media trained society to objectify women for so long and on some level, she used that objectification to her advantage but she also got a lot of great messages out into the world. If you listen to her songs, they've always been about self-love and being kind to yourself. I'm not sure why people don't talk about Madonna's work enough. People seem more fixated on her looks or her boyfriends. Her song lyrics were sometimes all I had to keep me going. She was one of the only people telling me I was worth anything in a world where I felt like a nothing or forced to compete for male attention. Madonna told me "You're enough, keep going." I didn't always agree with everything she did, but I usually understood what she was trying to say. I understood the point she was trying to make.

*I'm afraid of* – I'm not afraid of much anymore. I used to be deathly afraid of men and boys, especially the ones who would stick out their chests around me. Radio Account Executives used to frighten me. I've faced most of my fears at this stage in my life. I used to be all wrapped up in worrying about what other people thought about me. I only care about my kids' opinions now. I worry about finances like anybody else but money doesn't bring me much happiness.

*Hobbies* – I love amusement parks and carnivals. Covid-19 shut that down. These months in quarantine have been very hard on me and have felt like a death of sorts. When we moved to California, I was so happy to live close to Disneyland. I still haven't been able to go. I'm trying to stay positive.

I recently downloaded the Garage Band app. I've been writing and recording songs. I had no idea you could create an entire orchestra with a small iPad. I feel bad for the talented musicians replaced by computers. I know how they feel. It's frustrating but technology is here to stay.

*How did you get started on your own online radio show* – It's more of a hobby for now. I just got tired of not hearing women's voices promoted anywhere. Sure, women musical artists get a few plays on the radio, but if you look at the musical charts, they are still dominated by male artists. I just wanted to play women artists. It's a niche idea for the time being. It costs me more than I'd ever make if I tried to sell airtime, so I'm keeping it simple. I just wanted women's voices to be heard somewhere. I switch up the playlist every few days.


